Storm Debris Management Guidance

The information contained within this document was developed by Dane County and is intended to assist residents and local officials responsible for all or a portion of the issues relating to managing debris resulting from recent flooding events.

Local municipalities may be able to provide technical assistance regarding debris management. Local municipalities may also have primary responsibility for the oversight of proper management of debris following a disaster. You may also contact the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources for additional guidance on waste management.

This document is meant to serve only as a guide for proper disposal. It is not meant to be a complete list of disposal facilities. Dane County does maintain a longer list of facilities that handle these wastes. The longer list can be found on the Dane County Solid Waste website here: <u>https://pwht.countyofdane.com/recycle/categories.aspx</u>. Dane County compiles the list on its website from information provided by the facilities and companies, so Dane County is not able to verify that all information on the list is accurate at all times.
